Dear Friends,

Over the past month or so I have devoted a substantial amount of time to the re-writing of the School Handbook which is to be issued to parents of next year's new first year intake. The handbook not only gives a description of the school and what goes on inside the building but is both an implicit and explicit statement of our values beliefs and ethos.

I have been in post now for over three years and have purposely waited for a while before reviewing the Handbook, to allow me the time to understand the school and to give everyone associated with the Harris a better opportunity to know me. As I began to work through the various sections, Aims of the School, the Curriculum, Extra Curricular Activities and so on I gradually became even more aware of the years of input by successive generations of staff and pupils which had brought the various aspects of school life to the position in which we find them today. The doors which were completed in early September are a handsome celebration of the millennium and enhance the facade of the building. I will be in contact with you soon to extend an invitation to a formal ceremony to mark their installation.

Can I thank you all for your continued support of our school and look forward to seeing you in January at the Burns Supper.
